Change is Coming in the New Year

I hope that everyone had a great holiday season and that you were able to spend some quality time with friends, loved ones, and your four-wheeled passions!

As we begin to greet the new year, a couple of changes are on the club's horizon. From the local club's perspective, the most important upcoming changes involve our chapter officers. As mentioned last month, **VP Dean Noun** has stepped down from that post to tend to some personal matters.

I, too, must step back from my role as president for a bit so that I can "recharge." Yes, it has been a busy past two years! I would be willing to assume the VP slot to assist in a smooth transition for the upcoming 2024-'25 term.

Meanwhile, **Treasurer Eric Hahn** has expressed an interest in retaining his position.

Please consider this as an ideal opportunity for YOU to become more involved in the operation of the very successful and respected Arizona Chapter #29. We will be accepting nominations for all three of our chapter offices at the Wednesday, January 10th meeting. Voting will take place in February during our regular Second Wednesday monthly meeting.

In regards to changes happening on the national level, **POCI's Board of Directors** has had to take a hard look at reining-in the increasing costs associated with printing and mailing *Smoke Signals* magazine. One option would have been *CONTINUED NEXT PAGE...*

to raise our annual club dues, but that idea was not pursued. Instead, the Board has made the decision to reduce the total number of printed issues in 2024 during a two-step transition process that also encourages members to consider switching their membership to a less-expensive digital delivery plan, known as *E-membership*.


For the overwhelming number of POCI's *Regular Membership* members who receive their magazine in the mail, what will happen in 2024 is that the club will print and mail just NINE of its 12 annual issues. Those other three issues (*February, June, October*) will be available to all POCI members but only in a digital download format. Then, in 2025, the total number of issues created and sent out (whether it be printed for Regular, or digital for E-members, will be just nine.

Thereafter, you may opt to continue receiving the magazine in either format. In other words, the PRINT version of you magazine isn't going away; only the number of printed issues produced each year, effective immediately, will be reduced.

Yes, the digital version of *Smoke Signals* saves the club quite a bit of money in the long run since the cost of postage and printing is virtually eliminated. This is the reason why the Board would prefer that the thousands of worldwide POCI members voluntarily switch to the \$25 E-membership plan. And, some of you are already intune and comfortable with reading your magazine on a computer screen or smart phone.

Not me. Here are my personal thoughts on this topic: I have always preferred and will continue to opt for the printed version of the magazine through my continued \$45 Regular Membership (or whatever the cost for that might be at some point in the future). Simply said, I prefer to hold *Smoke Signals* in my hands, and I love the ability to glance through its pages without being dependent on an electronic device.

Meanwhile, all of the above magazine delivery changes are happening automatically; you aren't required to make any new decisions nor will you need to take any special actions. Regardless of your current membership plan, you'll continue to receive email notifications each month from the POCI Club Office in Minnesota to alert you when the newest issue of the magazine is posted online and can be downloaded and viewed.


RECOGNIZING and APPRECIATING OUR OUT-GOING VICE PRESIDENT DEAN NOUN!






