



Club meeting tomorrow night at Rudy's!

The "barn find" Trans Am

Club member Julian Grant tells about the family Black Bird he found collecting dust in California

GTO. He talked about the cars often during his visits with family in Compton, California. On

one visit, his cousin Anecia casually said, "You know, I have a Firebird also!" "I said 'No, you don't," Julian told her, "because I had never seen or heard about it," he said in an interview. "She said it was in her garage and I said, 'OK, I'll come check it out next time I visit.'"

On the next visit, he went to her place, and found the garage door broken. But through a side door, in the dark, he could see the outline of a car. "There were boxes everywhere but sure enough, there was a car in the garage. I couldn't really tell much because it was dark." But what did appear to be a car was not only a Firebird, but a Trans-Am. "I saw the front fender vents of a Trans Am," Julian said. "Then I saw it was a T-top car," Julian said. "It just got cooler and cooler as I got to see more of it."

He finally got the garage door open and could see the whole car.

Anecia's step-dad had bought the car brand new in 1978 at Arman Pontiac in Compton. and let her drive the car through high school. After that she gave it back to him and he parked it – for 22 years. "It was last registered in 1993," Julian said.

Anecia's step-dad passed away recently and her mom had title of the car and was ready now to sell it. Julian had first dibs.

A look under the hood showed everything on the 403 Oldsmobile motor was still intact. "Someone had broken into the garage and spraypainted the fender and stole the radio, but the rest was all there," Julian said.

With his other Pontiac projects, Julian said he couldn't really swing a third car, "but I didn't want to let this one get away." So, he enlisted the help of former co-worker Bill Goy. "He has just sold his Catalina, and so we went in as partners on the car."

After trailering it back to Phoenix, the guys washed the Trans Am a few times, get rid of the graffiti and buffed it out to a shine. "We changed all the fluids, put new plugs and wires on it, put in a new gas tank and new battery, and it started right up. It idled like a sewing machine."

Bill Goy sold this '62 Catalina at Mecum in 2022. Two weeks later, he got the call from Julian Grant about going in on the 'barn find' Trans Am.



The car had about 112,000 miles, and after a few drives in the car – and a hard push at the Good Guys autocross, it developed a rod knock. "We decided to pull the motor and put the motor I had in my Firebird into the Trans-Am," Julian said. The partners then rebuilt the transmission and rear end, put new disc brakes up front, along with a new suspension and new body bushings.

The car had power windows, door locks, and A/C. It is a WS-6, Julian said documents show, "but not sure it is an S/E."

Bill Goy said the car is in line for new Vintage Air and upgrades to the interior are underway, including new carpeting, sound deadening material, and ProCar front seats. The car may need some paint and body work down the road. "The big thing now is to drive and enjoy the car," Bill said.
