Get your motor(s) runnin'

Several club members getting closer to turning the key on rebuilds

What do Valley of the Sun Pontiacs club members Rex McWhorter, Mike Grimm, Mike Cichonsky, Paul Baumgartner, and Gary Rude have in common? They all have Pontiac engines undergoing rebuilds — with some really close to turning the key.



Guys like McWhorter, Cichonsky and Grimm – who has been working on the rebuild of his Pontiac 400 for the last two years (below, right) for his '74 Ventura – are getting ready to roll.

"I purchased the car in 2020 and everything leaked and I

could not get the 350 to run smoothly,"
Grimm said. "I believe the timing chain and the lifters were worn out. That and a very leaky transmission led to the rebuild. Some friends helped me pull the

350 in December 2022 and installed the 400 and rebuilt transmission in November 2023. I am working through final issues before starting the engine for the first time. I get about 4 to 8 hours a week to work on my car, so the progress has been slower than I wanted."

McWhorter did his rebuild after needing to replace the starter on the 400 in his '65 Lemans (top). "I did get my motor installed and running but there was a noise coming from the lower end so had to pull the motor and inspect the lower end again. I found a bolt on the baffle between the

oil pan and the crank was too long and the baffle was vibrating.

"Since I had it back apart I am re-checking the torque on the end caps and crank. It will be going back together in the next week or so. I have also decided to take my tranny out to add the lock up circuit on my 200-4R."

Others like Rude and Baumgartner are waiting patiently. "I am so excited to have my 455 engine rebuilt. I feel like a little kid at Christmas!" Baumgartner said on the club's Facebook page. -by Mark Neumann



Mecum Auction TV's "Professor" John Kraman passes away at 49

John Kraman, who has led the broadcast team on Motor Trend TV for Mecum auctions for many years and has been a life-long Pontiac fan, passed away. Reports indicate he was 49.

He joined Mecum in 2006 and has been the director of company relations and the company spokesperson at public events.

But his main role was as lead commentator/analyst for the Motor Trend broadcasts at the Mecum auctions across the country. Kraman would tell TV viewers about the hundreds of cars and trucks that rolled down the red carpet during Mecum auctions. Kraman knew something about every car that hit the auction block, whether it was a Ferrari or a Fiero.

In an interview with me for *Smoke Signals* magazine last year, he talked about his 1964 GTO (right) and the classic car market. "I bought [the car] in July 1976 for \$1,350 in Rockford, Illinois, It was owned by the brother of a school chum who had a stunning 1965 GTO convertible. I am the third owner.

"The original 389 ci/325 hp mill was gone so I built up a 65' 389 ci block from a Catalina, bored out to 400. I added 1967 code 670 big valve heads, a factory RAIV camshaft with 1.50 ratio rocker arms and a 1966 Tri-power setup I paid \$15 for!

"It is painted Cameo Ivory with mostly original dark aqua interior. I have recently purchased a set of repro Hurst wheels and a mint original 4 spoke sport steering wheel as I approach my 50th anniversary of owning this car.

"It's what I'd call a high-quality 'driver,' and I love it!"

When asked about the classic car market, Kraman called it "a very [random] market right now, and Mecum doesn't have much control over what cars are actually consigned. So, our auctions reflect what people [want to sell.]

"But for Pontiacs, my sense is the market is still very strong and solid. The big news in the Pontiac world goes back to last year with the Chuck Cocoma Collection of rare Ram Air IV GTOs. The crown jewel of his fleet — a 1970 GTO Judge convertible in that signature Orbit Orange color — brought just over \$1 million [at Mecum's Kissimmee auction].

"That was a significant car by any standard, but it completely reset the bar for the Pontiac marketplace. It's the first time any Pontiac had sold for that kind of money at a public auction." he said. -by Mark Neumann
